Robert Page, Ph.D., is Provost for the University and Foundation Chair of Life Sciences at Arizona State University (ASU), where he has also served as Vice Provost and Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences (2011-2013) and Founding Director of the School of Life Sciences (2004-2011). Before joining ASU, Dr. Page taught for 15 years at the University of California-Davis (UCD), where he served as Chair of Entomology from 1999-2004, and for three years at Ohio State University. He received a BS from San Jose State University and a PhD from UCD.

With a focus on behavior and population genetics, particularly of the honey bee, Dr. Page has published more than 230 research papers and articles and five books. He has received nine National Science Foundation grants, as well as grants from the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the Mercator and Gates Foundations, and the National Institutes of Health, Aging, and Mental Health.

Dr. Page has received numerous accolades for his work, including the Alexander von Humboldt Senior Scientist Award (1995), the highest honor given by the German government to a foreign scientist; election to the German National Academy of Sciences (1995), the Brazilian Academy of Sciences (1999), and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences (2006); and being named a Fellow of the Entomological Society of America (2012), a Fellow of the Wissenschaftskolleg zu Berlin (2009-2010), and a Carl Friedrich von Siemens Fellow.
